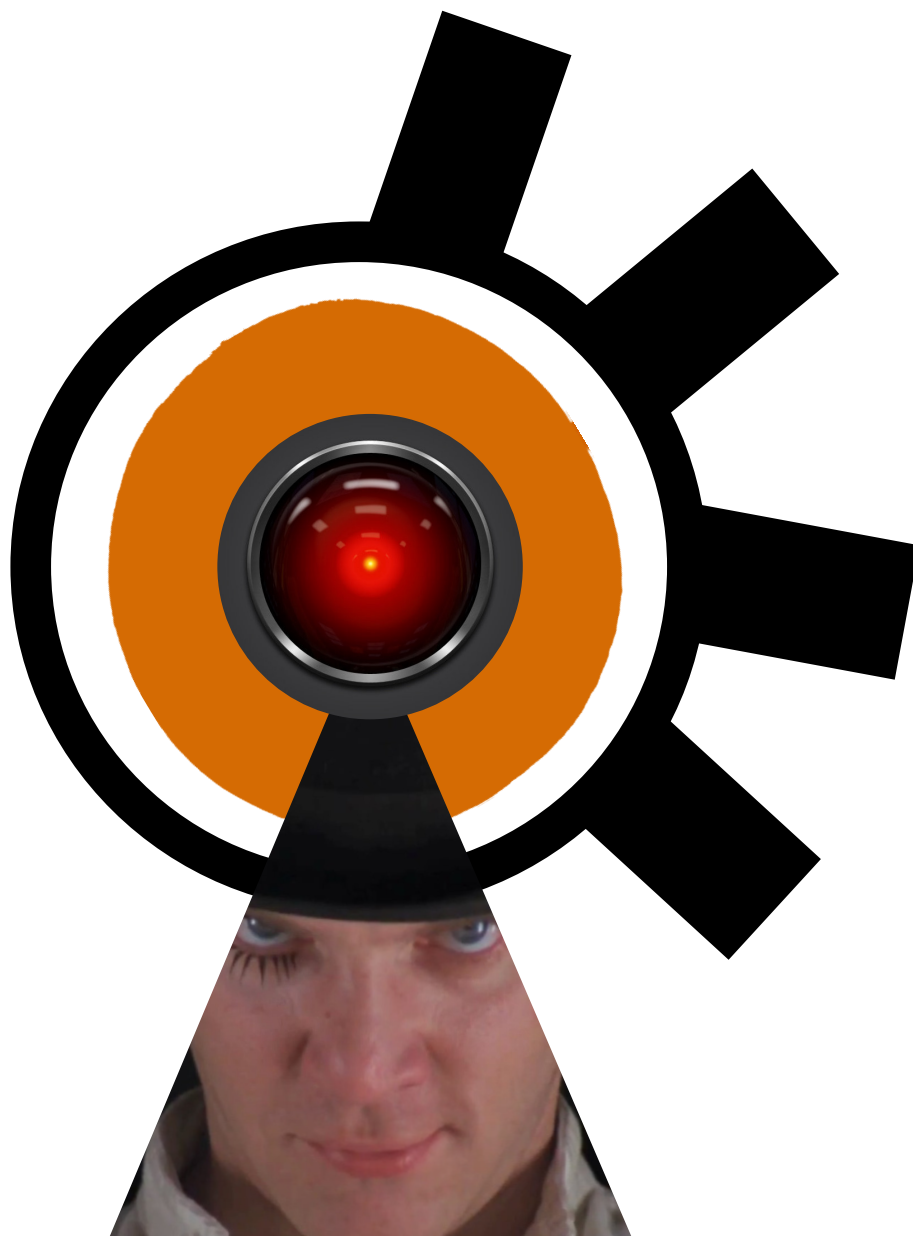

STANLEY KUBRICK



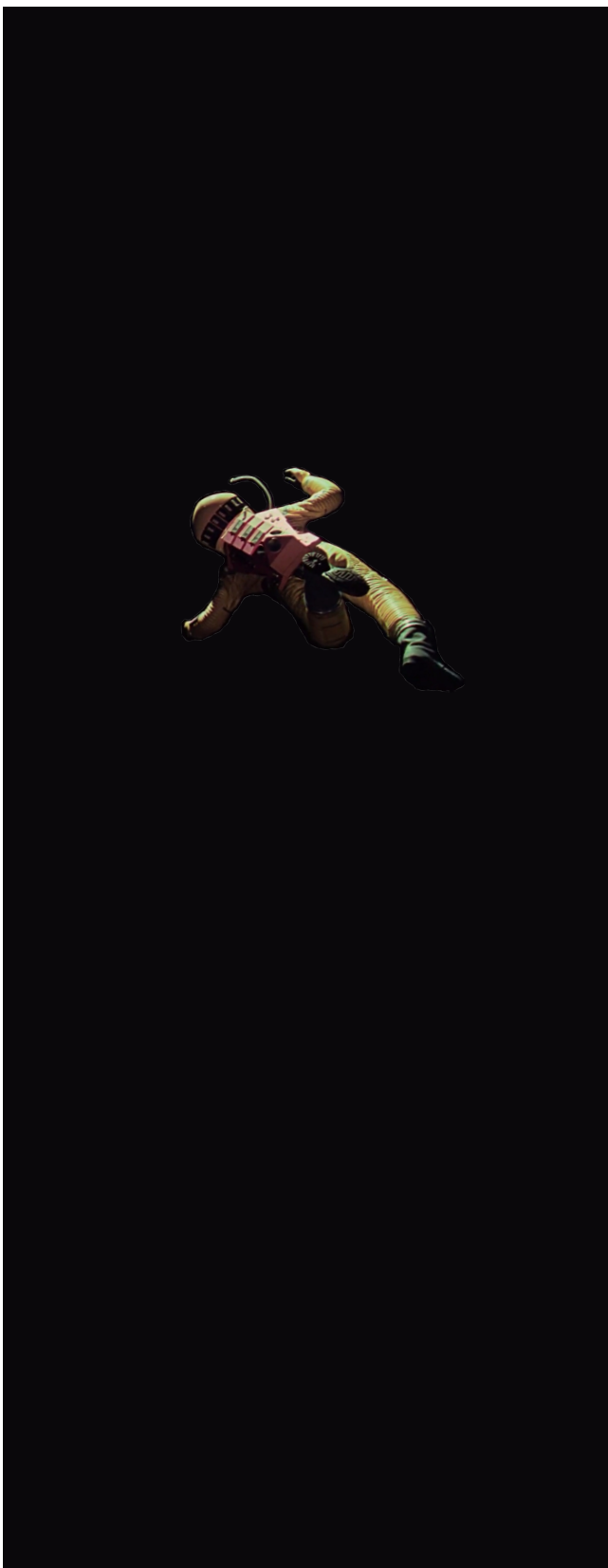
